I am currently reading Brian McLaren’s new book *Naked Spirituality: A life with God in 12 simple words*. One of the things McLaren analyzes is how we experience spirituality in the day to day, moment to moment lives most of us live. While many of us yearn for a spiritual experience that is dramatic and thus life changing, ancient religious theories and contemporary theories of education and human development agree that: “a way of life is formed by practices. By practices, we mean doable habits or rhythms that transform us, rewiring our brains, restoring our inner ecology, renovating our inner architecture, expanding our capacities. We mean actions within our power that help us become capable of things currently beyond our power.” McLaren.

At Prince of Glory, I am convinced God is up to something in our midst, and that God is yearning for us to dig deeper into our spiritual lives, developing habits and rhythms that will sustain and empower us to do the missional work that God puts before us in within our church, in our community, and beyond. I believe the vehicle for enacting such a change in our midst is to ask each of you to consider adopting the marks of discipleship, a way to create sustainable habits and rhythms in our spiritual lives. God is calling us to: pray daily; read the Bible daily; worship weekly; nurture relationships with those closest to us; serve our church and community; and give of our time, talent and resources as God directs our path.

The summer months, with a more relaxed schedule, provide many of us with the opportunity to experiment with the marks, to live into them and let God do what God does, changing our lives and driving us to be the disciples we were created to be. Will you join me on this spiritual journey that I believe God is leading us on?

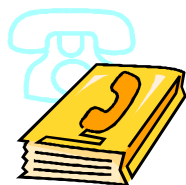

POG COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS for May 2011

This summary has been prepared to assure our congregation is aware of Council actions

Pastor Bob

* Five Meet & Greet sessions were held with 12-20 people attending each session. It provided an avenue for dialog with Pastor Bob and many things were learned from the sessions.

* Holy Week services were unusual and well-attended. Many thanks to Ron Carmona for creating the Good Friday cross. The cross of flowers on Easter morning was very beautiful

Actions

* Sage Hegdal is involved in a breast-feeding support group that is looking for a space to meet twice a month for a few hours. The Council agreed by acclamation this was a worthwhile use of the church.

Pastor Bob will bring a proposal to the next Council meeting.

Finance

* Income for the period of January to April is on target. However, there is a need to reign in spending. A proposal will be presented to the Council at the next meeting intended to help everyone deal with expenses and budgets. All committees will be notified of their budget(s) and the current status of expenses compared to the budget(s). Also, a simplified procedure will be proposed to identify approval procedures for various levels of spending.

* Polo and T-shirts should be done this week.

* Status of fund raising for Mbulu trip and “contingency plans” – Three people are hoping to participate in the trip. Numerous fund raisers have been held to help defray the cost of the trip. The trip is October 10-24, 2011. A presentation will be given on May 22 at the first and second service. If someone is unable to attend, their allotted funds will help the remaining delegates. Any unused funds will be given to the Mbulu church

* Discussed nursery staff requirements and the need for an adult to work with Nicole Grilli in the nursery.

* Discussed move of Staff Office and New Library and a suggestion for placing a small window in the South wall of the project.

* The sink hole in the front yard was caused by cracked tar seals in the drains and was fixed for \$835.

Thanks to Dave Bugbee for identifying an economic fix to the problem.

* The city has announced they have identified sidewalk slabs to be replaced and will be billing us ~\$2700 for the repairs. Dave will talk to the city representative about possibly challenging some of the slabs identified. He will also ask about the possibility of extending the deceleration lane on 14 mile to include our driveway.

* ***The alarm keypad code will be changed over on June 1, 2011.***

* Will be monitoring water use every three days to try and identify spikes in use.

* 50th Anniversary – Praise for a wonderful celebration. At the upcoming Synod Assembly, Prince of Glory will be recognized for our 50th Anniversary.

Constitution Committee Update

The last amendment to the Prince of Glory Constitution and By-laws occurred in 1988, just after the merger of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America and the Lutheran Church of America. The POG constitution mirrors the 1988 ELCA model constitution, which has subsequently been reviewed and revised every couple of years. Because of this, there are a number of differences between the synod's model constitution and the POG constitution. A committee, comprised of Donald Dickison, Dan Erickson, and Lori Bluhm, has completed a comprehensive review of POG's constitution and by-laws, along with our great pastoral and council leadership. After this review, the Committee recommends modifications that would clarify the constitution and the by-laws, as well as accommodate changes in the law and some procedural improvements. Most of the proposed changes are minor language changes only. Some of the changes address procedures that apply to other synod congregations. However, if POG's constitution is amended in any way, then there are certain mandatory clauses in the synod's model constitution that must be included, word for word, in our constitution.

The proposed revisions have been reviewed and recommended for approval by the church council.

The congregation will have the opportunity to vote on the proposed amendments at a special congregational meeting, which is scheduled for Sunday, June 19, 2011 after the second service.

A more detailed explanation of the recommended amendments will be provided at that time. In addition, there is a summary of the changes that is found on the POG webpage, and on the bulletin boards. If you have any questions, please contact any member of the constitutional committee.

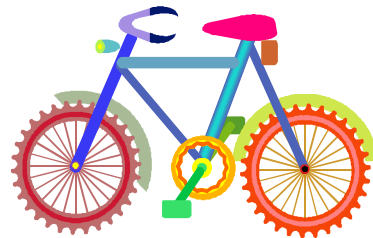

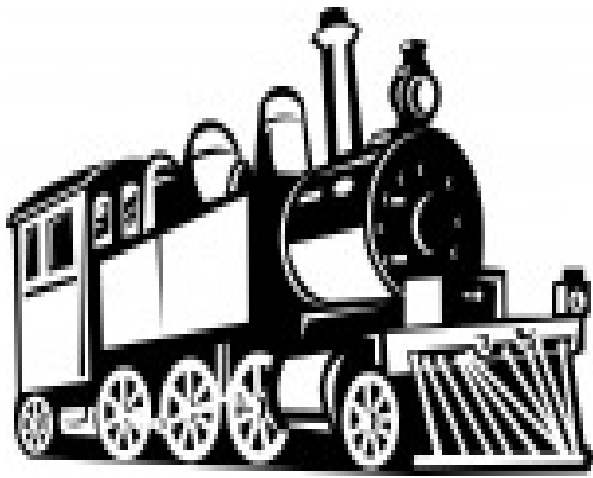

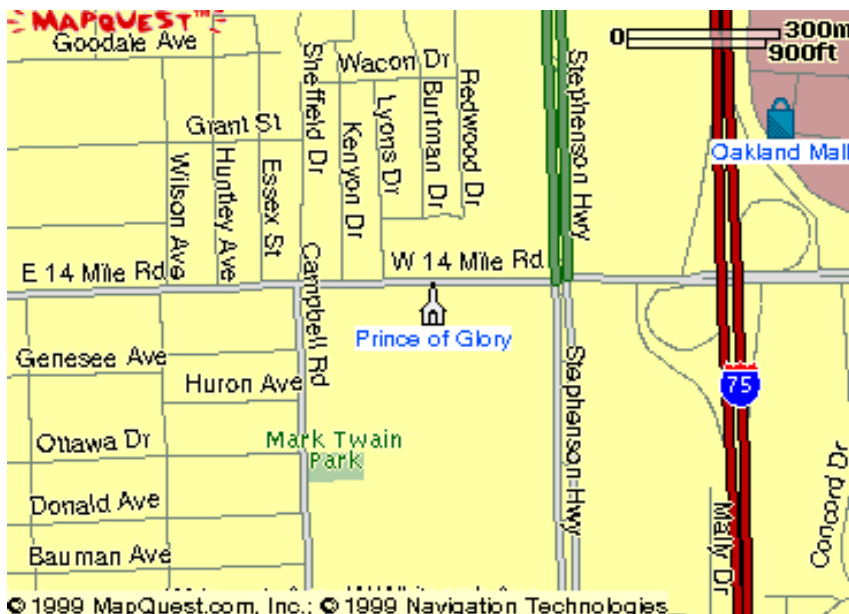
